Proposed ordinance's title/reference: ORDINANCE 51-25 AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAPE CORAL, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE OF THE CITY OF CAPE CORAL, FLORIDA, ARTICLE 3, DEVELOPMENT REVIEW, CHAPTER 1, DEVELOPMENT REVIEW PROCEDURES, SECTIONS 3.1.2. AND 3.1.3.; AMENDING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE OF THE CITY OF CAPE CORAL, FLORIDA, ARTICLE 10, SUBDIVISIONS, CHAPTER 1, SUBDIVISIONS, SECTIONS 10.1.3., 10.1.5. AND 10.1.6, REGARDING ADMINISTRATIVE APPROVAL OF PLATS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals and welfare): The purpose of the ordinance is to change the path of final plat approval from a council action to an administrative action. The change is being done to comply with Florida SB 784 which took effect July 1, 2025 requiring plat or replat submittals be administratively approved.

Administrative approval will streamline the plat approval process and potentially reduce costs for applicants.
