Proposed ordinance's title/reference: Repeal and substitution of Chapter 20 Water Wells, Cape Coral Code of Ordinances regulatory function with Lee County assumption of primacy for well regulation as established by Lee County Ordinance No. 23-14 Lee County Well Code

Summary of the proposed ordinance: Cape Coral Ordinance Chapter 20 Water Wells establishing the requirements for water well contractor licensure, vehicle identification, well permitting, permitting fees, sample collection, submittal and reporting, well construction, casing grouting, abandoned well repair or plugging, materials, well repair or replacement, test wells and borings and inspections for the purpose of groundwater resource protection repeal and substitution of well regulation function by Lee County with regulation of wells within Cape Coral as established by Lee County Ordinance No. 23-14 Lee County Well Code. Effective well regulation protects groundwater resources that provide water supply for the residents and business of Cape Coral.
- 2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, forprofit businesses in the City of Cape Coral, if any:
- (a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur; An approximate 8.0 percent decrease in the commercial irrigation well permit fee, an approximate 46.0 percent decrease in the well plugging permit fee and an approximate 25.0 percent decrease in the elevator shaft drilling permit fee.
