



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the April 3, 2024, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Community Recognition: Cape Coral Soccer Association

City Council and the City Manager recognize the exemplary achievements of Cape Coral residents. The Cape Coral Soccer Association is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year, making it one of the longest-standing soccer associations in Southwest Florida.

Council Discussion Regarding FEMA National Flood Insurance Program Decision

City Council discussed FEMA's decision to retrograde Cape Coral's Community Rating Service rating for residents with a flood insurance policy under the National Flood Insurance Program. The City Manager presented Council with a detailed timeline of actions taken during Hurricane Ian's recovery, and Council authorized the City Manager and Mayor Gunter to write and send letter(s) requesting additional meetings on the topic to urge FEMA to reverse their recent decision.

Council Approves Purchase of Vehicles, Equipment Under Fire Operations Fund and Water and Sewer Fund

City Council amended Resolution 266-23 to include the purchase of additional vehicles, corresponding peripheral equipment (upfitting), and equipment within the Fire Operations Fund and Water and Sewer Fund and approved the disposal of any City-owned surplus tangible personal property.

Council Approves Installation, Repair, and Monitoring of Security Systems at Yellow Fever Creek

Council approved Resolution 97-24, which approves the installation, repair, and monitoring of security systems at Yellow Fever Creek Preserve with Integrated Fire and Security Solutions, Inc., in accordance with Collier County School District Contract #23-090. This request is for security cameras, network connectivity, and access door security at the new visitor center located at Yellow Fever Creek Preserve

Council Approves Resilient Lee Recovery, Resilience Plan

City Council approved Resolution 115-24, which endorses the Resilient Lee Recovery and Resilience Plan developed by the Resilient Lee Recovery Task Force. This plan creates a broad regional framework developed by the Resilient Lee Task Force.

Council Approves Remodel of Special Populations Center Restroom

Council approved Resolution 73-24, authorizing Contract #BPW2437MM between the City and Newson Construction & Consulting, LLC, to remodel five restrooms in the Special Populations Center building.
