



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the August 6, 2025, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Community Recognition Award: Cape American 10U Baseball Team

The City Council and the City Manager recognize the exemplary achievements of Cape Coral residents. The Cape American 10U team had a stellar performance in the 2025 youth baseball season, which included a state championship.

Council Approves Weir 7 Improvement Project to Alleviate Flooding

Council approved Resolution 198-25, awarding a bid to Zep Construction for the Weir 7 Improvement Project for \$1.5 million. Weir 7 is in the 400 block of Mohawk Parkway between SW 5th Avenue and SW 5th Place. Improvements will help alleviate flooding in this area of the City.

Council Approves Lift Station Replacement Supported by Grant Funds

Council approved Resolution 199-25, awarding a bid to Andrew Sitework for the Lift Station 120 Replacement Project for \$2.1 million, supported by a \$620K grant. Lift Station 120 will be relocated from a roadway median to improve maintenance access and accommodate a new emergency power generator protected by a weather-rated enclosure and designed to withstand a 500-year flood event.

Council Accepts Grant Funding for Park Maintenance

Council approved Resolution 216-25, accepting grant funds from the Tourist Development Council for \$584K. This grant funding will be used for beach park facility maintenance and the purchase of associated equipment.

Council Accepts Grant Funding for Jaycee Park Amenities

Council approved Resolutions 217-25 and 218-25, accepting grant funds from the Tourist Development Council for \$564K and \$941K, respectively. This grant funding will be used to pay for the Jaycee Park Boardwalk Overlook and Jaycee Park Restrooms projects.

Council Approves Lot Purchases for Stormwater Pond Construction

Council approved Resolutions 226-25 and 227-25, authorizing the purchase of lots to construct stormwater ponds. Planned roadway improvements on Kismet Parkway West between Burnt Store Road and Old Burnt Store Road are part of the North 3 Utilities Extension Project, adding impervious surfaces requiring stormwater management. Therefore, the City needs to acquire land to provide areas for stormwater runoff.
