



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the October 8, 2025, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Business Anniversary Recognition: 50 years or more

The Cape Coral City Council recognizes local businesses serving the community for over 50 years.

- Raso Realty: Located at 4812 Cape Coral Street and proudly serving our community since 1973.
- Ken's Auto Shop: Located at 4533 Del Prado Boulevard and proudly serving our community since 1973.
- Acra Electric: Located at 842 SE 46th Lane and proudly serving our community since 1975.
- Robin Dawn Dance Academy – Located at 244 Santa Barbara Boulevard and proudly serving our community since 1975.

Council Approves Sands Bridge Construction

Council approved Resolution 286-25, approving expedited construction of the bridge on Sands Boulevard, which was damaged during Hurricane Ian in 2022. While staff were nearing completion of the design for permanent repairs, a 2025 inspection revealed accelerated seawall deterioration and erosion caused by Hurricanes Helene and Milton.

Council Approves North Water Treatment Facilities Exploratory Well Installation

Council approved Resolution 289-25, approving an exploratory well installation for the North Reverse Osmosis (RO) Water Treatment Plant. The North RO has one Injection Control well, and testing showed that site conditions are unsuitable for a second deep well. A City-owned site about half a mile east was chosen for exploratory drilling to assess its suitability for a new deep injection well serving the North RO and future North Water Reclamation Facility.

Council Accepts Grant Funds for CCPD Ballistic Shield Purchase

Council approved Ordinance 293-25, accepting grant funding from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program for \$116,875. This grant funding will purchase ballistic shields for the Cape Coral Police Department.

Council Approves Resolutions Related to the North 1 East UEP Area

Council approved Resolutions 294-25, 295-25, and 296-25, which outline how the City plans to build and pay for irrigation, wastewater, and water improvements in the North 1 East UEP area. The resolutions outline what improvements are needed, how much they

are expected to cost, and how property owners who benefit will share those costs. The resolutions also set a public hearing for November 19 to review the proposed assessments and how they will be collected, with notices sent to property owners and published beforehand.
