

In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the December 10, 2025, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

## **Council Accepts Grant Funding for Art Center Marketing**

Council approved Resolution 363-25, accepting \$8,000 in grant funding from the Lee County Tourist Development Council to be used to market the Cape Coral Arts Center in FY 2025-26.

Council Approves Location, Accepts Donation for Youth Council Love Locks Project Council approved Resolution 371-25, approving the location of the Cape Coral Youth Council's Love Locks Sculpture at Cultural Park, and authorizes the City to accept a donation of labor and materials from Tip Top Welding, LLC, to construct the metal Love Locks sculpture.

Council Approves FWC Invasive Vegetation Removal at Four Mile Cover Preserve Council approved Resolution 376-25, approving a Memorandum of Agreement with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission for the removal of invasive exotic vegetation at Four Mile Cove Preserve, for an amount not to exceed \$200,000, paid for by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. The City is required by the State of Florida to maintain the preserve in a substantially natural state, including the removal of invasive species.

Council Approves Provider for Waterway Access Improvements at Redfish Pointe Council approved Resolution 379-25, awarding a bid to Bayside Dredging LLC for a Redfish Point Dredging Project in the amount of \$469,210, plus a 5% contingency of \$23,460.50, for a total project amount of \$492,670.50. This project is authorized through an Army Corps of Engineers permit and a Department of Environmental Protection authorization and is intended to restore safe navigation for emergency response and canal-to-river traffic in the area.

Council Affirms Yacht Club Redevelopment Public-Private Partnership Qualification Council approved Resolution 381-25, acknowledging the redevelopment of the Yacht Club Community Park as a qualifying project under the Public-Private Partnership (P3) Statute, Section 255.065 of the Florida Statutes, to facilitate P3 opportunities.

Council Approves Economic Development Incentive Agreement with Bones Coffee Council approved Resolution 385-25, providing an Economic Incentive package to Bones Brands, LLC, totaling \$2,729,652, for the construction, development, and relocation of its existing business to a new location within the City.
